ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The CMAA received \$17,000 from the Greater Lowell Health Alliance to support their Hepatitis B workshops in conjunction with summer barbeque events.

These barbeque events provided education on Hepatitis B in both English and Khmer, screenings, and referrals, while bringing community members together over a fresh, free meal.

Two, 25-minute workshops were taught by Lowell Community Health Center representatives, along with a CMAA health educator and interpreter. In addition to the barbeque meal, members were given \$15 gift cards for their time spent at the event.

OUTCOMES

Three successful barbeque events were held, which educated over

160

low-income community members.

Funds were also used to pay for the Director of Programs time, two bilingual health educators, youth outreach workers, gift cards, and supplies.
