Lowell Police Department LPD/LYDC Drug Awareness Event \$2,500 Was awarded in mini-grant funds by the GLHA (2014-2015)

Purpose

The LPD, with a commitment to community engagement and policing, has developed numerous partnerships with community organizations over the years: in 2006, the Lowell Youth Development Collaborative (LYDC) was formed to build partnerships between various youth-wellness agencies and the LPD.

The LYDC had identified **drug awareness education** and **youth jobs** as the largest priorities for the 2014/2015 school year. To address this issue adequately, the LPD and LYDC, in a joint-effort, planned to hold a drug-awareness event in October: National Substance Abuse Prevention month.The event was focused on educating children, teens and parents

Goals & Objectives

To implement a **two-pronged approach to the event**: In one section, there was programming for older teens and parents, featuring a keynote speaker who discusses the impact of loss due to heroin overdose, a panel discussion with District Attorney Marian Ryan, and representatives from various local non-profit orgs. The second part of the event are educational games for youth, led by youth and adult supervisors.

> Established 4 measurable goals: At least 200 people attend the event. At least 50 parents attend the event At least 75 teens attend the event At least 75 children under the age of 13 attend the event.

Outcomes

Parent attendance had actually exceeded their goal of 50 attendees. Many teens, mostly from the Lowell High School, had attended, and their goal in this area was reached as well.

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There were a limited amount of children in attendance, so this goal was not completely met.

Parents had expressed great satisfaction with this initiative, and a desire to continue this educational week for subsequent years.
