 WITH KEY COLLABORATIVE
 PARTNERS TO DISCUSS REFERRAL
 PROCEDURE. THIS WAS DONE TO
 PREPARE THE MHAGL FOR THE
 APPLICATION OF DIRECT SERVICES.
- THIS PROJECT ALSO SOUGHT TO PROVIDE DIRECT CLINICAL
 SERVICES THROUGH PROVIDING INTAKE ASSESSMENTS TO A
 MINIMUM OF 90 UNIQUE YOUTH OR ADULT CLIENTS, AND PROVIDE

DEPARTMENT, UNITED TEEN EQUALITY CENTER (UTEC), AND LOWELL SCHOOLS.

 CLINICAL PREVENTION SERVICES INCLUDE INDIVIDUAL, FAMILY, AND GROUP WORK. ADULT CLIENTS, AND PROVIDE INDIVIDUAL PREVENTION EDUCATION TO 70 UNIQUE CLIENTS AFTER ASSESSMENT. OF THESE CLIENTS, AT LEAST 75% WILL BE REFERRED TO FOLLOW-UP SERVICES. MHAGL ALSO SOUGHT TO

FACILITATE 6-8 WEEK PREVENTION AND EDUCATION GROUPS.

OUTCOMES

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- THE SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION SPECIALIST HAS DEVELOPED A RESOURCE GUIDE, AND CURRICULUM FOR ALL 30 OF THE MHAGL'S CLINICAL STAFF.
- A CONNECTION WAS MADE WITH THE COMMUNITY LIAISON AT THE LOWELL POLICE DEPARTMENT. THEY ARE NOW ABLE TO MAKE REFERRALS, OR REQUEST COLLABORATION AS NEEDED.
- SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION SPECIALIST HAD MADE CONNECTIONS WITH THE LOWELL TRANSITIONAL LIVING CENTER, LOWELL HOUSE, AL-ANON AND ALATEEN, AND NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS.
