SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER EDUCATION-PREVENTION WEEK

The Board of Health of Chelmsford, with the assistance of the Tewksbury Police Dept (which had already had two successful Substance Abuse Education and prevention weeks), received \$20,000 in 2014-2015 grant funding to organize a week dedicated to educating the community on substance abuse.

OUTCOMES

- APPROXIMATELY **4,400 PEOPLE** WERE REACHED THROUGH THE VARIOUS PROGRAMS SCHEDULED DURING THE WEEK OF OCTOBER 26TH, 2015.
- DUE TO PROGRAMMING DONE DURING THE SCHOOL DAY, THEIR TARGET POPULATION OF STUDENTS (3,700 ATTENDED PROGRAMMING)
 WAS SUCCESSFULLY REACHED.
- A MINIMUM OF 1 EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITY PER GRADE LEVEL WAS MADE FOR GRADES K-12.
- NETWORKING WITH STUDENTS WAS ABLE TO BE INITIATED THROUGH AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS.
- ASSISTED LOCAL TOWN DEPARTMENTS WITH CREATING THEIR OWN SUBSTANCE ABUSE
