

FREE TRAINING OPPORTUNITY

Middle Aged Men and Suicide – A Troubling Trend

The Samaritans of Merrimack Valley, a program of Family Services of the Merrimack Valley, is offering a free, Department of Public Health-funded training for clinicians to reduce the incidence of suicide among men ages 35- 64 in the Merrimack Valley. After the training, participants will be able to identify risk and protective factors, warning signs, ask questions about suicide risk, develop a safety plan, understand the importance of lethal means restriction and provide middle aged men with resources.

2 Continuing Education Credits (CEUs) are available for licensed social workers, nurses, Licensed Mental Health Counselors (LMHCs) and Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselors (LADCs). Certificates for 2 hours are available for all others.
