

Life Connection Center is a homeless outreach center and community kitchen focused on serving people with uncompromised compassion and care. With a goal of "Saving Lives Across the Table", Life Connection Center believes that the road to recovery, health and wholeness can start over a home-cooked meal. We believe that food brings people together, it can aid in relationship building and can truly be the medicine we all need.

Currently, Life Connection Center is providing meals, groups and recovery services to over 1500 individuals living with homelessness, poverty, addiction and poor health. Guests enjoy a complimentary highly nutritious meal and access other services as needed such as overdose education, individual peer counseling, nutrition education, HIV/STI testing, wellness checks, clean syringe access, and referral to various medical and social service providers. We also have a mobile van outreach operation that utilizes the same method of relationships-based intervention and trust-building which provides encampment outreach, syringe access, distribution of healthy foods and transportation to various services. We have two recovery groups, Recovery Church (Faith-based) on Wednesdays at 3:30 and Coffee & Conservation on Thursdays at 3:30. Both of these groups are run by persons with lived experience. Our doors are open for persons currently struggling with substance use disorder looking to reduce harm in their current use.

Lowell Community Health Center (Lowell CHC) is a federally qualified health center serving low income, immigrant and refugee populations in the Greater Lowell (MA) area. Services include: primary medical care; OB-GYN; behavioral health services; HIV testing; counseling and treatment; Office Based Addiction Treatment (OBAT) program; alternative therapies; case management; community health promotion; specialty care; 403(B) pharmacy; dental and vision clinics; an afterschool youth development program; and comprehensive school-based health clinics. Lowell CHC is the community partner of Wellforce Care Plan, a MassHealth Accountable Care Organization (ACO) Partnership Plan to improve access to care and reduce health disparities for low-income individuals and families. Our mission is to provide caring, quality and culturally competent health services to the people of Greater Lowell, regardless of their financial status; to reduce health disparities and enhance the health of the Greater Lowell community; and to empower each individual to maximize their overall wellbeing.

In addition to its outpatient clinical programs, the OBAT department has a team of outreach educators who provide a variety of overdose and opioid related educational workshops, trainings and patriciate in community events. New projects are being incepted to provide more group work with specific populations such as women and recently released men from incarceration.



In February 2015, the Lowell Health Department received the Partnerships for Success 2015 (PFS-2015) grant from the Department of Public Health, Bureau of Substance Addiction Services. The goal of the grant is to implement evidence-based prevention programs, policies, and practices to reduce the nonmedical use of prescription drugs (NMUPD) amongst individuals ages 12 to 25 years old in the high-need communities throughout the Commonwealth.

The Lowell Partnerships for Success (PFS) Coalition was started as a means to bring awareness to and educate youth and parents/guardians on the topic of NMUPD. The PFS Coalition is working on social marketing campaigns aimed towards youth and parents/guardians with the intention of decreasing the NMUPD and increasing proper storage and disposal of medications. The PFS Coalition helps to educate and provide resources to youth-serving agencies within Lowell, including sports teams, classes, and after school and summer programs. PFS Coalition members also host resource and educational tables at community events.

Based out of the Tewksbury Police Department, SAPC works collaboratively with the communities of Billerica, Chelmsford, Dracut, Lowell, Tyngsboro, Westford and Wilmington to provide universal prevention intended to prevent underage drinking and other drug use in our youth. Research has shown that addressing the issue of underage drinking reduces the risk that youth will go on to use opioid and other substances as well as help prevent addiction.

Our efforts include cost effective, evidenced-based prevention training with the Botvin-LifeSkills curriculum, community forums and table talks, the use of mass media to send appropriate positive messages, sticker shock and social hosting liability campaigns. We are an active member of the Massachusetts Opioid Abuse Prevention Collaborative (MOAPC) as well as the Greater Lowell Health Alliance (GLHA) allowing for cohesive and consistent messages across our communities.

the highest level of wellness for all Westford residents and employees by reducing the incidence of illness and death. This is accomplished by assessing community needs, adopting and enforcing health regulations and implementing improved community strategies to provide affordable quality health care and preventative health programs and services.

Our Substance Misuse Prevention Program works closely with Westford Police, School Departments, the Westford Parent Support group, Community Behavioral and Mental Health Committee, and other local and state organizations to bring substance use prevention programs to the community. We have helpful resources available on alcohol, tobacco, drug and substance use.

The Westford Health Dept. accepts from Westford residents, used syringes, needles, and lancets only, no prescription or non-prescription medication will be taken at the Health Department. Please ensure that they are brought in a puncture proof container (such as a detergent bottle) and placed in the smallest containers possible. This will help minimize costs associated with disposal. There are two kiosks in the police lobby, one for sharps disposal only and the other for medication only.

Funded by the Town of Wilmington, the Public Safety Department has an in-house clinician whom has the ability to serve anyone connected to Wilmington, MA. The clinician works primarily in partnership with police and fire/EMT around calls for service involving mental health and substance use; in addition, the clinician assists in resources sharing, referrals and admissions, continuum of care, service applications, brief treatment, and crisis assessments. Community members can access services outside of police/EMT involvement by contacting the Wilmington Police Department or by stopping into the station, all involvement is voluntary at the individual's choice. In addition, the Wilmington Substance Abuse Coalition organizes prevention and educational events to encourage community involvement and awareness of mental health and substance use across ages.

The Lowell Community Opioid Outreach Program (CO-OP) is an innovative program made up of first responders and clinicians that brings together public and nonprofit organizations to address the opioid crisis in the City of Lowell. The CO-OP is a partnership between the Lowell Police Department, Lowell Fire Department, Lowell Health Department, Lowell House, and Trinity EMS.

The Lowell CO-OP is committed to reducing the number of deaths attributed to overdose and is helping its clients towards the path to recovery by bridging the gaps in treatment services. The CO-OP follows-up with overdose victims and their families within 24-48 hours of an opioid overdose and facilitates access to treatment and harm reduction services for the overdose survivor and supportive services for their families. Children of overdose victims are referred to Project CARE for therapeutic and support services. The Lowell CO-OP completes outreach work specifically in the Lowell community by following up with clients in personal residences, the local shelter, and camp sites and offers education on treatment services, harm reduction, and other support services. The Lowell CO-OP also builds relationships with treatment providers and other local resources.

The Syringe Collection Program (SCP) was created to educate the community on the importance of safe and proper sharps storage and disposal, and to respond to discarded needle pick-up requests within the Lowell community.

The Syringe Collection Program Coordinator builds relationships with community organizations to identify locations of frequent needle discard, proactively removes discarded needles from reoccurring in public places, coordinates educational activities surrounding safe needle protocol, and is available to support community clean-up efforts. The Syringe Collection Program Coordinator also works to educate community organizations, neighborhood groups, schools, and youth-serving agencies regarding the importance of avoiding used sharps and the protocol to report discarded needles that are found in the community.

There are two ways to report a discarded needle found in Lowell during program hours:

- Call the program. Leave the address and specific location of where the needle(s) was found, the number of needle(s), and any additional information that is relevant to locating the needle(s). While it may be helpful to leave a return phone number in case more information is needed to locate the discarded needle(s), service is confidential and anonymous.
- Electronically submit a "Report a Hyperdermic Syringe" report. To do this, log into Civic Plus via the City of Lowell's website, www.lowellma.gov.

For discarded needle pick-up requests outside of program hours, residents should call the Lowell Police Department non-emergency line at 978-937-3200. The Lowell Police Department will report the request to Trinity EMS. Residents *should not* call Trinity EMS directly to report a discarded needle.



The NAN Project is an initiative that promotes mental health awareness and suicide prevention programs in classrooms across Massachusetts. We do this through a peer-to-peer model, where our peer mentors present their comeback stories to students with the goal of opening up the conversation around mental health issues and reducing the stigma. These stories detail their struggles with mental illnesses, trauma, sexual identity/orientation or other issues facing young people, but more importantly, discuss the supports they were able to access and the coping strategies they have employed to get on to a path to recovery. This approach creates a safe space for students to discuss mental health and related topics and educates them on the resources available and steps to take when concerned about themselves or a peer.

So that this is not a one-and-done approach, we also work with students to develop Peer Leadership Teams within the schools that will continue to educate their classmates about mental health, emotional wellbeing and the available supports through regular activities and events throughout the school year. We also provide professional development for school staff on the signs, risks and responses to a student in crisis, to ensure that there are trusted adults available to provide support for their students.

We have trained over 120 Peer Mentors and are constantly looking for additional young people that share our desire to tear down the stigma around mental health. The goal is to show all young people that there is help and there is hope.

environment. Backed by Lowell House, Zack's House was purchased and designed to fill a major gap in recovery services to young men in early recovery from substance misuse. Typically, young men in early recovery go from the highly structured recovery home environment to independent living in a sober house with no transition and no community supports.

Zack's House fills that dangerous gap by providing a transitional program that includes: Daily meetings with an on-site recovery coach to review their recovery plan, work on developing job and independent living skills and plan for a sober future.

Gender/Trauma-specific clinical groups.


